Donating to Kiva-Senior Global Politics Class
 Kiva is crowdfunding to help fund micro loans support ventures in developing countries.
 Repayment rate for loans is 96.8%.

Partner program distributes the money and evaluates the potential loan requestor.

May support people looking to increase or start a family business/store.

Provides an opportunity for students to learn more about the people and countries that they give loans to.

Students are looking to raise \$2000 and asked MPACT to match the funds raised. Future classes can reinvest the money as loans are repaid.

Students will also contact local businesses and banks for additional funds outside of MHS. If anyone has contacts or expertise please let the students know.

Students hope to finish fundraising before winter break.

Jeriamiah asked if money could be managed through MPACT. A drop down item could be added to the MPACT PayPal site as long as donations were noted "MPACT for Kiva" How long have they been around? How much money collected? How much money distributed? More than 1 million people have donated. Started about 7 years ago. They have an office in Portland. They are endorsed by the Wall Street Journal and other well known companies.

- ASB would like MPACT to consider supporting appreciation for service members and Veterans by having a service football game and bar b que with tailgating before the game. The hope is to bring in service members. October 25th vs Westview. Free bar b que for service members. Would advertise to the community. Leadership needs grills to use for the event of help fund grills that Leadership could use for other events. Also need yard games, volunteers, advertising, food donations.
- Parking was very hard to find for the last home game and people had to park in the
 neighborhood across the street which says Tow away Zone. How can the school
 accommodate the regular football traffic and the extra members of the community for
 tailgating. Leadership plans to reserve spots for tailgating. ASB made flyers and email.

- Email Leadership if have contacts or donations. BSD has a large grill that they loan out .c.
 events. Not sure of the process to use it. MPACT is currently in discussions for obtaining grills
 for use at MHS.
- Jen asked for a parent to volunteer to help ASB with organizing this event.

Principal Welcome and Update - Todd Corsetti

- Great start to the school year. Almost 900 students at the dance. Some kids got overheated, but it was a great dance.
- Expectations were discussed in class meetings last week. No Senior pranks. Students will be suspended and not allowed to walk at graduation if prank.
- Large classes. Enrollment at about 1850 kids. Freshman class is 60 over last year's projection. Any additional staff won't be approved until second semester. All the high school numbers are up. 30 new staff started this year.
- Parking is a problem that can't be solved. We have 325 spots for student parking and over 700 seniors and juniors. Some overflow spots in staff lot. Changes to parking pass allocation will be made for next year. Tow away signs in neighborhoods might not be city approved. Public streets are public streets. Might do Seniors only parking and a lottery for everyone else. Visitor spots will be moved to staff lot. No long term fixes until vineyard is gone.
- MPACT needs to inform volunteers about parking challenges they might face.
- The City of Beaverton restricted the amount of parking that could be built.
- BACK to School Night October 9 at 6:30.
- Principal Coffee is this Friday, September 20th.Talking about Student Success Act requires feedback from parents and staff in order to apply for funds for the district. Could get \$35 million.
- Athletics are having success.
- Band had a great fundraiser and earned \$10,000.
- 380 Seniors, 420 Juniors, 450 sophomore, 420 Freshman

Treasurer Report – Julie Blaufuss

Fundraising - Paul Francasso


- Ongoing fundraising is Quotes for Good with State Farm. We get \$10 for every quote. Glenn

- MPACT general meetings were live-streamed last year. Only 5 viewers so it wasn't continued.
- If Principal Coffee Talk is recorded it is posted to the website.

President Report - Jen Sande

- Board voted to support a grant project so Jeremiah Hubbard can supply guitars so kids can go during free time to decompress through music. Guitar Center gave a discount and donated picks, stands, strings and more.
- 5K for this Saturday is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances.
- Back to School Night we staff a Spirit Gear booth. We will need volunteers to staff it.
- MPACT won't have a table at Back to School Night, however, we will be showing a video message with info about MPACT and how to get involved or find information.

- Jody volunteered to be a liaison between MPACT and SPED program. Unified Club has general education students participate in activities with students receiving special education. She hopes to be a bridge and make needs of SPED students known. There are 3 programs at MHS: Structured Learning Class, Academic Learning Center and ISC (Independent Skills Class). MHS has an apartment where kids can learn daily living skills. Also a work skills program to prepare for sheltered employment when older. She hopes to be in contact with the 3 SPED teachers and see what their needs are and how MPACT can help. Classes are understaffed with Educational Aides so volunteers are needed daily.
